Advent Candle Lighting Liturgy

A: When the people were looking for deliverance, the prophet Micah declared, "But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah...from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient day." (Micah 5:2). But what if Micah is also talking to us, proclaiming, "But you, O Joyful Harvest Lutheran Church, from you shall come forth for me..." What? What might God be calling forth from us? DEVOTIONS



Read: Romans 1:1-7.

The birth of Jesus is not about the sweet presence of a smiling baby. It is about the work of God to save the world by entering our experience and being with us (Matthew 1:23). Ours is the God who promised this beforehand through the prophets, who has come in the flesh in the line of King David, who rose from the dead and is recognized as the Son of God. We are the beloved of God and named holy. With the birth of Jesus comes the fulfillment of God's action to change the world of darkness and despair to the dwelling place of God's loving and saving presence for all the world. It includes a divine assignment to love all people with the good news of Jesus Christ. This is what Advent, Christmas, and the Christian faith are all about. Discuss: How is this kind of love more of an action than a feeling?

Pray: Dear God, we thank you for entering our world and our lives with hope and love. Help us to love the world you love in the name of Jesus, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

SERVICE &



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you share God's love with someone in need?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



This week light four candles on the Advent wreath: the Candle of Hope, the Candle of Peace, the Candle of Joy, and the Candle of Love. The Candle of Love reflects how God showed love for us by sending Jesus to be with us. During this Advent season we pray for the hope, peace, joy, and love of God through Jesus Christ.

Leader: This is the fourth week of Advent. Advent means coming. We are waiting and watching for the coming of Christ. Let us light the candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love. [Light four candles]

All: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." (Matthew 1:23)

Leader: Let us walk in the light of Christ that gives us love.

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, we await your coming with hope, peace, joy, and love. May we see with the eyes of faith the work of your kingdom in our lives and world. Amen.
